Workplace sexual harassment in Ag is a growing concern that threatens the lives and health of farmworkers & the integrity of our Ag communities. Workplace training and policies vary from farm to farm, for some workers there are none at all. Growers, supervisors, and workers have raised the need for a sexual harassment prevention training program specific to the needs of this industry and culturally appropriate for farmworkers.

Research and Prevention

To address this gap in WA state, PNASH researchers launched a community-engaged research endeavor, bringing together growers, farmworkers, and advocates, to understand the nature of this problem, explore the underlying causes, and develop solutions. The Workplace Sexual Harassment Prevention Toolkit, currently in development, integrates the results of this research, the perspectives of growers and farmworkers, and the expertise the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, NW Justice Project, PNASH Center and WA State Human Rights Commission.
