Grant Funds Available through Professional Training Opportunities Program (PTOP)

The Northwest Center for Occupational Health and Safety supports occupational health & safety education and training in Alaska, Washington, Oregon, and Idaho. Through the Professional Training Opportunities Program (PTOP), grant funding is available to support **students from all disciplines and fields of study** for projects and activities that address worker health.

Who is eligible? Graduate, Post-Doctoral, Undergraduate, or Associate's degreeseeking students from any discipline or field of study. *Also eligible to apply are staff or interns of non-profit, labor or community-based organizations.*

What kind of activities qualify? For their proposal, the applicant may propose a (1) Research project or demonstration; (2) Internship or other learning experiences; (3) Activity or program. *All proposals must address health and/or safety issues in the workplace or for working populations*

How much money? A maximum of \$10,000 will be available for each project/recipient, but expect most projects will be for lesser amounts. *
