











Coronavirus Basic Prevention Measures

COVID-19 coronavirus is a new respiratory illness that can spread from person to person. The following precautions can help prevent virus infection spread on forest jobsites.

	<p>Stay home, or head home, if you show symptoms: fever, cough, short of breath—If sick, call supervisor.</p>
 	<p>Washing hands is top priority, and frequently; or use alcohol-based sanitation with at least 60% alcohol.</p> <p>Cover coughs and sneezes—catch in your elbow. Avoid touching eyes, nose, mouth with hands.</p>
	<p>Deploy social distancing on jobsite — maintain at least 6 feet spacing between each worker.</p>
	<p>Reduce size of any group at any one time to under ten (10) people; LIMIT all in-person meetings.</p>
	<p>Minimize ride-sharing. Add extra vehicles. In-vehicle, ensure healthy riders, clean practices, good ventilation, and voluntarily use masks or covering over mouth & nose.</p>
	<p>Avoid sharing tools, radios, controls with others, if possible. Assign to one user (label with tape or paint).</p>
	<p>Clean and wipe to disinfect on regular basis—frequently used tools, equipment, and hand-touched surfaces (door handles, machine controls, handrails, phones, switches).</p>
	<p>Use proper personal protective equipment (PPE) to clean and disinfect (gloves, eye protection).</p>
	<p>If N95 are not available, voluntary use of surgical masks or cloth covering worn over mouth & nose to minimize airborne spread when less than 6ft away.</p> <p>Alert: These alternatives do not prevent the inhalation of fine aerosols. So should be used with distancing, and washed or disinfected daily.</p>
