Funds Available

through

Professional Training Opportunities Program (PTOP)

The Northwest Center for Occupational Health and Safety supports occupational health & safety education and training in Alaska, Washington, Oregon, and Idaho. Through the PTOP program, small grant funding is available to support **applicants from all disciplines and fields of study** for projects and activities that address worker health.

Who is eligible? Students (Associate's degree, Undergraduate, Graduate, or Post-Doctoral-seeking from any discipline or field of study) and non-profit staff/employees at organizations interested in developing OHS expertise.

What kind of activities qualify? For their proposal, the applicant may propose:

- (1) A research project or demonstration;
- (2) An internship or other learning experiences; or
- (3) An activity or program.

All proposals must address health and/or safety issues in the workplace or for working populations

How much money? A maximum of \$10,000 (including direct and indirect costs) will be available for each project/recipient, but expect most projects will be for lesser amounts.
